#### Susan Feudale, Our Golden Apple Winner

From the moment you walk into Susan Feudale's second grade classroom, you recognize the compassion, dedication, and



eagerness of a teacher who educates, loves, and nurtures her students. As a teacher of young children at St. Martin's, Mrs. Feudale is regarded as an inspiration to her students, co-workers, and all who enter her classroom.

"Mrs. Feudale combines a passion for her faith with a love of learning to

create an environment that fosters the growth of the whole child," explains Principal Stephen Lamont.

On May 25, Susan Feudale was presented with the Golden Apple Award by the Archdiocese of Washington Catholic Schools Office, marking a special way to celebrate her 19th year of teaching at St. Martin's. The award sponsored by the Donahue Family Foundation recognizes the teaching excellence and dedication of ten local Catholic school teachers every year and includes a \$5,000 check and

a golden apple. Anne Dillon, Assistant Superintendent for School Operations and Student Services, was among the Catholic Schools Office representatives in attendance to present the award.

In a statement nominating Feudale for the Golden Apple Award, Father Wells wrote about the impact that she has had on her students, noting, "She lives and shares her faith, and is passionately dedicated to the education of her students. She goes the extra mile in and out of the classroom to make St.

Martin's a vibrant, faith-filled, family centered school."

Mrs. Feudale was born in Silver Spring, Maryland and spent her childhood in Florida and South Carolina before returning to the area. She graduated from the University of Maryland with post graduate work at Trinity College in Washington, D.C. While attending Catholic school in Columbia, South Carolina, Mrs. Feudale experienced rich Catholic traditions and saw her faith flourish. She began her teaching career at public schools but it was not until she began teaching at St. Martin's that she found her true vocation. Her two daughters, Calli Ann and Gabriela, were attending St. Martin's and she would volunteer in the library and help with Writer's Workshop in second grade. When a first grade position became available, she immediately applied to then Principal Shirley Wise and was hired. "It was and continues to be one of the greatest blessings of my life," declares Mrs. Feudale.

Her classroom is warm and inviting, adorned with student work, resources, motivational messages, and religious symbols. Her students are loved, challenged, and supported to strive to achieve and hold themselves accountable for their own learning. Mrs. Feudale's lessons are engaging, accessible for all types of learners, and responsive to student needs and interests. As Vivian Abudayeh,

Home and School Association President, parent, and alumna describes, "Her cheerful personality, love of God, and her dedication to our students are a gift to our school. She ensures students receive the attention they need, whether it is one on one, additional help, or just extra love." Mrs. Feudale further explains, "I think it is important to have high expectations for students to help them see what they can truly achieve. With continued support, love, and encouragement, students can work to their full potential." She also never misses an opportunity to make school fun because then as she says, "students never want to miss a day."

During the summer of 2020, Mrs. Feudale approached Principal Lamont about moving with her students up to second grade, a recently vacated position. She felt there was more work to be done with her students whose year was interrupted due to the building closure in March of that year. Additionally, Mrs. Feudale wanted to prepare her students to receive their sacraments in second grade. Principal Lamont asserts, "She embraced growth, flexibility, and leadership as she transitioned to this new grade in the middle of a pandemic."

Beyond the classroom, Mrs. Feudale is a spiritual steward, academic leader, mentor, and a source of joy. Teaching at a Catholic school offers occasions to wear many hats and Mrs. Feudale welcomes these opportunities. She is on the Religious Life Committee, is an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist, and coordinates morning prayers. She welcomes new members into our community —

teachers, students, and families alike – and helps them assimilate into our school culture. She also coordinates multiple grants with the City of Gaithersburg to provide afterschool enrichment and academic support programs. When asked about her extraordinary contributions to the St. Martin's community, she adds, "The friendships and bonds that are created here among students, staff and parents are lifelong. They are an extension of Jesus' love for us and you can feel it whenever you walk through the door. Our graduates, former colleagues, and parents know that they can always stop by for a little sense of family."



Before the surprise presentation, the school was holding its Honors Assembly in the gym, where we recognized students who received third quarter honors and Crusaders of Character certificates for ethical behavior. It was an exhilarating experience for Mrs. Feudale when presented with the Golden Apple Award, while surrounded by her co-workers, students, friends, and family. She said, "I am incredibly grateful to all those who came to celebrate with me. I am



truly honored and blessed to have received this award. I thank God for giving me this vocation and for blessing me with all those who have been part of this joyful journey!"

Celebrating the bestowal of Susan Feudale's Golden Apple Award helped bring together her family, our

school community, our faith in God, and our appreciation for the love of learning; all of which are the driving forces behind Mrs. Feudale's achievements and success as a Catholic school teacher.


